Participation fee

20 Euro – per fencer for individual competitions

The fee must be paid before any fencer from the offending country will be allowed to compete.

Registration

According to the system of registration for EFC

Referees

Teams (clubs, representations) are supposed to provide referees according to the following rule:

1-4 fencers in the team no referee required

5-9 fencers 1 referee

10-15 fencers 2 referees

16-20 fencers 3 referees

1-2 Team 1 referee,

3 Teams and more 2 referees

One hour before start of competitions there will be seminar for referees in the main venue provided by EFC Referees commission delegate. Participation of referees is mandatory!

All referees must be entered through EFC website in the same way as fencers. 500 Euro will be charged for every missing referee, otherwise fencers will be excluded from the competition.

Formula of the competition

Individual competitions: elimination table with "repechage" from T-32. One round with groups followed by direct.

Team competitions: direct elimination team competitions.

Participation

Each national federation may enter a maximum of 20 fencers. The organizing country may enter up to 64 fencers.

Team participation is open to all countries.

Equipment

No name on the back of the fencers is required. The use of FIE equipment is mandatory (800NW uniform and plastron, 1600NW masks, FIE homologated blades).

Poznań

One of the oldest and largest cities in Poland, the capital of Wielkopolska, Poznań offers an opportunity to visit a place inseparably connected with the beginnings of Poland. Mieszko I had here his stronghold in the ninth and tenth centuries. He was probably baptized here in 966, joining the group of medieval rulers of Europe. This event is considered to be the beginning of the Polish state, and its history can be found in the Gate of Poznań, a modern heritage interpretation center. Visiting Poznań, you will unlikely overlook the Old Market Square, with its beautiful Renaissance town hall. Worth visiting are also the Poznań Croissant Museum; Lake Malta, regarded as one of the best and most beautiful professional regatta courses in Europe; the former Imperial Castle; and Stary Browar, recognized in 2005 as the best medium-sized shopping center in the world. Hundreds of atmospheric cafes, clubs, pubs and restaurants are located throughout the city. Several of the restaurants were distinguished in the prestigious restaurant guide Gault & Millau Polska. Poznań is currently one of the largest Polish centers of trade, industry, sport, tourism, culture and education. As many as 140,000 students attend the universities located here, making the city one of the four largest academic centers in Poland.
